

## Checking for Quality Wood Furniture

Wood furniture has a special place in the hearts of many homeowners. They can be regarded as investments which can serve their purpose for more than one generation. Their age only contributes to their already artistic designs. Many people would not hesitate to be a little bit more generous when it comes to buying wood furniture. However, it is quite understandable that a good number of people also think twice before buying wood furniture. Practicality gets the best of people, and this holds them off from possibly buying what they've been dreaming of for a long time. Here are some tips for those who are in this category:

When looking for doors or drawers, try feeling if it has a sense of weight and solidity, like high-quality furniture would have. Check the hinges if you are looking for a door in particular. Make sure that they are not loose, and that they can easily handle the weight of the door.

For larger pieces of furniture like cabinets or entertainment centers, check their base. There should always be a leveling device there. You can tell if a certain piece of furniture comes from higher quality manufacturers if they use heavier, more decorative and substantial hardware in construction.

Check tables by placing your hand on a corner and try moving it. If you are met with less resistance, have the legs checked.

When inspecting tables with leaves, they should have sash locks or metal latches to keep them in place. Try looking for table leaves that are completely aproned, and as wide as 18 to 22 inches. Furthermore, try looking for watertown extension slides if you have tables which extend to a total length of 120 inches or more.

Test drawers. They should move smoothly when pushed, and they should not bind if you pull them out to its extent. Feel the interior of the drawer; it should be smooth to ensure that it has been sanded and sealed. Higher quality drawers will have guides of wood or metal.

Better pieces of wood furniture will definitely have wooden back panels which are integrated into the whole piece, and cheaper models will have panels of substandard material nailed on the edges.

Make sure that the entertainment center you are looking for can accommodate all of the appliances you plan to put in them. Check for electrical outlets, cable hookups and swivel trays for TVs, etc.

These tips should give you an edge in making decisions when the time to buy wooden furniture comes.
