

Learning How to Put on a Condom

Are you wanting to know how to put on a condom? If you are planning to engage in sexual activity with someone that has not been tested for sexually transmitted diseases and if you have no other protection against pregnancy, you certainly need to use a condom. After all, the last thing you want is to have an unplanned pregnancy or to catch a disease from your partner.

In order to make sure you are safe, you need to learn how to put on a condom. If you don't learn how to put on a condom properly, you risk the chance of tearing the condom or experiencing leakage. If this occurs, the benefits of using a condom will be negated and you will spend the next several weeks worrying about pregnancy or disease!

If you have never learned how to put on a condom, it is best to practice before the heat of the moment. When you are excited and getting ready to have sex, you will be even more likely to do something wrong when putting on the condom. Not only will this be an unnecessary risk for you, it can be quite embarrassing as well! After all, you don't want the person you are getting ready to have sex with staring at you as you fumble with a condom.

So, take the time to learn how to put on a condom before the moment arrives. Then, use the same brand of condom when you do engage in sexual activity. That way, you can be certain you will know just what you are doing.

The first thing you need to know when learning how to put on a condom is to use care when opening the package. Don't use scissors or your teeth because you may accidentally tear the condom. Once you remove the condom, do not unroll it. Not only will this make the condom more difficult to put on, it will also make it more likely to rip or tear.

After the condom is removed, the next step in how to put on a condom is to place the condom on the tip of your erect penis and then unroll it down the shaft. If you have difficulty unrolling the condom, you might have put it on the wrong way. In this case, you will need to throw the condom away and use a new one if you are going to actually have sex. If you are just learning how to put on a condom and do not plan to have sex with the condom, however, you can simply flip the condom over and then unroll it.

If you purchased a condom with a reservoir tip, you should unroll the condom completely and allow the reservoir tip to remain limp. If your condom does not have a reservoir tip, on the other hand, you will need to leave a little bit of space at the tip of the condom so the semen can be collected safely.
