Immersing Yourself In Culture

For those who'd like to experience some of the local culture, there are several events to take advantage of. The Keswick Jazz Festival is a 5-day musical romp that brings together 150 jazz bands in various venues throughout Keswick. If crazed and unusual delights are closer to your heart, visit the Festival of Fools. It's another 5-day event that includes side shows and performances by jesters (perfect for children). If art is your passion, you'll want to make time for the annual Printfest which showcases contemporary original prints that you're unlikely to see elsewhere. There, you can mingle with other art enthusiasts and even speak with the artists whose prints are on display.
